Environment Condition within remit? Stable or changing? Known hazards.

Skills Familiarity of leader. Ability of participants.

Communications Plan Between leaders – phone, text, rendezvous point, times. With committee –

phone numbers.

BRIEFING

Communications Signals (Verbal, Hand, Paddle). Passing on and back.

Roles Leader, support, spacing, buddies.

Hazards Likely, known specific. Prior experience. Peer pressure.

Actions On Incident management – Who? How? Escape routes.

Strategies and Plans Order of descent, running rapids, timing.

DURING ACTIVITY

Benchmark Early assessment of ability. Set challenges and watch performance.

Communications Accurate, Brief and Clear.

Line of Sight Maintain between paddlers. Controlled descent. Count numbers.

Avoidance is better than cure. Plan, Do, Check, Act.

Position of Maximum Usefulness. Leader position, group positions.
